HIGHLIGHTS

FDC Philadelphia hosts Reentry (STAR) Program Graduate

On December 12, 2013, Marcus Pollard, a former inmate, and Supervision to Aid Reentry (STAR) Program graduate, visited FDC Philadelphia, to hold “Town Hall” style meetings in two pretrial housing units. Mr. Pollard shared his history and journey through the justice system from start to finish, highlighting his completion of supervised release through the STAR Program. By sharing his path from inmate to productive member of the working community, he was able to engage the inmate population about the importance of preparing for release.

Mr. Pollard stressed the importance of getting involved in vocational training and reentry programs while incarcerated, and to take advantage of programs like STAR and Philadelphia’s Office of Re-integration Services (RISE) Program. He discussed how he was able to use the computer skills training he gained while incarcerated, and the job readiness training he received through STAR and RISE, to gain an administrative position with the City of Philadelphia.

The event was coordinated by Scott Barrett, FDC Philadelphia’s Reentry Affairs Coordinator, Cyndi Zuidema, Reentry Coordinator for the United States Attorney’s Office and Jana Law, Supervisory United States Probation Officer, Eastern District of Pennsylvania. Due to the event’s success FDC Philadelphia plans to host similar Town Hall Meetings with STAR Program graduates.

FPC Alderson hosts visit from state officials

On December 12, 2013, Dr. Carolyn Stuart, Executive Director of the state’s Office of Minority Affairs, and her assistant toured FPC Alderson to learn about different programs and classes being offered to the inmate population. The office works to serve the people of West Virginia and open a dialogue on issues that affect minorities. Dr. Stuart, who is a member of Governor Earl Ray Tomblin’s Reentry Committee, was impressed with all the programming available to the inmates and is interested in returning to volunteer in the future.

Lori Sablan

On December 25, 2013, Lori Sablan, Correctional Counselor at FCI Herlong, passed away in the hospital in Reno, Nevada. She was 50 years old. Ms. Sablan served honorably in the United States Army for over ten years including time in the Middle East during Operation Desert Storm. She began her career with the Bureau of Prisons as a Correctional Officer at FPC Nellis in 1997. Ms. Sablan transferred to FPC Yankton in 2001, and she was promoted to Lieutenant at FCI Herlong in 2005. In 2013, she became a Correctional Counselor.

Universal Children's Day Celebration at MDC Guaynabo

On December 11, 2013, and December 18, 2013, MDC Guaynabo's Education Department coordinated and hosted their first celebration of Universal Children's Day for inmates and their children in the visiting room. A total of 32 inmates and 58 children participated in the activities. Educational materials promoting improved and positive relationships between incarcerated parents and their children were distributed along with a Reading is Fundamental book. Arts and crafts activities were also provided for the children.

FCI Elkton hosts mock job fair

On December 17, 2013, FCI Elkton's Education Department and Reentry Affairs Coordinator hosted a mock job fair at its satellite camp. Participants from Kent State University, Small Business Administration, Ohio Rehabilitation Services Commission, Equal Employment Opportunity Commission and Renewal RCC, Pittsburgh, provided inmates with feedback about communication skills, body language, professional dress, and interview content. Forty-six inmates participated in mock job interviews and had positive remarks about their experience at the event. An informational job fair was also held at the FCI with outside participants providing information on their agencies.

Institutions Serve the Community

FCI Talladega

During the month of December 2013, staff at FCI Talladega volunteered with 2nd Chance, Inc. in their annual Gift Wrap fundraiser, which helps to raise money to furnish the everyday needs of each shelter and those housed there. 2nd Chance, Inc. is a non-profit 501 c 3 organization that provides safe shelter and supportive services to victims of domestic and sexual violence escaping abusive situations. They also offer educational outreach to the community to create awareness and strengthen the movement to end domestic and sexual violence. 2nd Chance, Inc., along with the Federal Women's Program, encourages anyone who is a victim or knows of someone who is, to seek help.

FCI Memphis

From December 9, 2013 through December 16, 2013, ten camp inmates from the Federal Prison Camp in Millington, Tennessee participated in the One Memphis Operation Christmas Basket Program. Reentry Coordinator Bobby Hager, and other FCI Memphis staff, escorted the inmates to the Cook Convention Center. The inmates assisted by assembling boxes, filling them with food, and loading the boxes on delivery trucks.

The One Memphis Operation Christmas Basket Program is a Memphis community event organized for the purpose of sharing the joy of the holiday season with thousands of families, seniors, and the disabled who are in need. The staff and inmates, along with the mayor of Memphis, representatives of the United States Navy, several other corporations and community groups, assembled more than 5,000 holiday food baskets.

FCI Miami

FCI Miami staff chose names from a "Giving Tree" and bought gifts for children being helped by Kristi House and Camp Matecumbe. Kristi House is an organization that provides support for sexually abused children, and Camp Matecumbe is an organization that provides after school and summer care for school age children with a variety of mental, physical and emotional disabilities. Staff granted the wishes of 26 children by purchasing from a list of specific gift requests.

FCI Bennettsville

On December 18, 2013, FCI Bennettsville staff donated gifts to the Marlboro County Department of Social Services (DSS). The FCI's Affirmative Employment Committee sponsored a Christmas Stocking Project for DSS foster children. DSS provided the names of 32 foster care children in need during the holiday season. Each FCI staff member who sponsored a child received a wish list and purchased toys, clothes and gifts throughout the month of December. The wrapped gifts were distributed by DSS staff to the children on Christmas Eve.
